Special Instructions for Advisors and Advisees:

The world of theatre is extraordinarily rewarding, but also demanding and competitive. Academic loads are not light, production work is demanding, so students wishing to prepare for success in careers in theatre are must develop extraordinary work ethic and discipline in the development of their vocal, physical, mental,

and emotional attributes and skills. The development understanding of acting performance is needed by each technician, and the development of a technical skill is need by each performer. Private voice, singing in the Musical Theatre Ensemble, and dance classes are suggested every semester for all performers.

Goal and Career Development is required every semester for all Theatre Majors. This class substitutes for PREP 499 Career Preparation and Planning which is a General Education requirement.

Theatre Participation is required for all students on Theatre Activity Scholarship. See the ACTIVITY GUIDELINES page for requirements for all students on Theatre Scholarships or involved in productions.

Theatre Courses are listed above with the opportunity for the design students to take a Senior semester abroad or studying in another culture, which requires getting necessary upper class required courses in the appropriate sequence and completed, if possible, by the end of the Junior year. This also gives the student the opportunity to take advanced independent studies. Courses that cannot be completed by the end of the 3rd year can be arranged in summer or another time if necessary so that students can do internships or study in another culture.

We strongly suggest that during one summer, students do summer theatre, at Southwestern College or elsewhere, which may be taken for academic credit.

The Southwestern College Theatre Department provides opportunities every year for students to expand their horizons by studying the arts in New York City, in regional theatre cities like Chicago and Minneapolis, or internationally in England, Europe or Asia. Such study is invaluable to studying the theatre and the arts in our world, as well as opportunities for a life and/or career in the arts. Travel opportunities are on scheduled on a four year cycle so students can take as many opportunities as possible, and may get credit for their study.
