Each school year, a new or near completion PhD candidate in an area of religion is selected and is provided with a \$20,000 fellowship and housing.

During the school year, the visiting scholar teaches in the undergraduate program, participates in campus ministry, assists with the Discipleship program and preaches/ teaches with the Worship Outreach groups.
