## Keynote Speaker



### Rev. Adam Hamilton

Rev. Adam Hamilton is the founding pastor of the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas. Adam has received the B'nai B'rith award in Social Ethics, the Denman Award in Evan-

gelism, and the Circuit Rider Award for excellence in church leadership. He was named Distinguished Evangelist of the United Methodist Church by the Foundation for Evangelism, and he was named one of the "Ten People to Watch in America's Spiritual Landscape" by Religion and Ethics Newsweekly.

The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection has grown from four people in 1990 to over 12,000 adult members with an average weekly worship attendance of over 7,500 in 2006.

### Sarah Wilke

Wilke leads an international staff of 81 with offices in Nashville and Johannesburg, South Africa. The division publishes The Upper Room daily devotional guide read by almost 3 million people in more than 100 countries in 76

editions and 40 languages.

Wilke has served as the CEO of UMR Communications and United Methodist Reporter, in Dallas, Texas, since 2004.

She is credited with successfully turning around the operation – increasing revenue from \$3.8 million in 2004 to \$6.3 million in 2008.

Wilke previously served on the extended cabinet of the North Texas Conference as urban strategist and as executive director of Wesley-Rankin Community Center, a Methodist mission in inner-city Dallas. She holds a master of business administration from SMU.

### Stacy Welk



Stacy has been the executive director of the Jubilee Park since 2008. Stacy earned her bachelor's degree in Inner-Disciplinary Studies in 1997 from Southwestern College.

Stacy started with the Wesley-Rankin Community Center as a volunteer and worked her way up to executive director of the organization. She has been recognized twice by ExxonMobil, in 2004 as "Community Champion" and in 2006, as "Outstanding Community Champion".

### Dick Merriman



Dick has been Southwestern College's president since August 1998. During his tenure Merriman has overseen construction projects such as Cole Hall and the new Jantz Stadium; significant renovations of the college's Mossman Hall, the college library, and the college's landmark 77 Steps and Mound; addition of five graduate degrees; expansion of professional studies programs and growing enrollment in online studies; and an increase in total enrollment to about 2,000 students.

### Mitch & Jan Todd



Jan and Mitch are both United Methodist pastors. Jan is the pastor of Pleasant Hill United Methodist Church, and Mitch is the associate pastor of Lawrence First United Methodist Church. They met at Southwestern College where Mitch was a music composition major and Jan was a business major. It was here they shared their love of writing and performing music.

Mitch and Jan have written lots of songs together and put out two studio albums - *Love Matters* and *Hundreds of Miles* - and a self-produced Christmas Album - *Christmas Joy*.

### Cheryl Rude



Cheryl joined the staff of Southwestern College with a dream. She dreamed of a program that would help students turn leadership potential into actual skills. As director of leadership development at Southwestern, Cheryl was charged with developing such a program, one unlike any other available. In 1997 the National Association of Leadership Educators honored the program as the best in the nation.
