

Cynthia Compton – affiliate faculty member accomplished in musical theatre direction and accompaniment.

Invest in your future!

The full cost of the festival is \$450, which includes a double room in an SC residence hall for six nights, three meals per day, instruction with professionals and one on one mentoring, insurance coverage, and supplies.

A commuter option is also available if you choose not to stay overnight on campus. The commuter's cost for the festival is \$350, which includes meals, insurance, instruction and supplies.

Registration is due June 6, 2011. If space is available, late registration will be accepted through June 15, 2011, on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration will be held to a maximum of 40.
